ECC expansion site updates:

- Saginaw County implementation is on hold until new coordinator is hired and onboarded.
- Wayne County is interviewing for a new coordinator but will continue to see families on the docket and continue to move towards fidelity of the Safe Babies Approach. Currently 9 families are active on the docket with 4 expected reunifications. Wayne ECC continues to address docket and workforce capacity while working to establish ECC at all 3 districts.
- St. Clair County continues with site implementation, hosted 1st Active Community Team meeting with 30 Community members, and currently has 2 families on the docket.
- The evaluation and data team has completed the draft of the retrospective study of Wayne County Baby Court and a draft awareness video that is currently under MDHHS communication review. Both will be shared with the SAG once finalized.

Legislative and Sustainability Work Group Update

Amy Zaagman provided updates and discussion regarding meeting with the new judiciary chair, Representative Lightner. The Representative requested a Q & A with the Wayne County jurist, coordinator, and clinician active with the work. Amy noted the legislative and sustainability workgroup has been on hold until there is a better understanding of who will support the draft bill post-election. Amy reported still identifying whether ECC belongs under problem solving or family treatment courts. Amy posed question for SAG members to explore the Governor's budget proposal for the next couple years and whether we look to seek appropriations or statutory bill at this time. More follow-ups will be done to find these answers.

Group Discussion: Shared Vision and How our Collective Work Impacts and Supports Children and Families with Shadi Houshyar, PhD., Director of Health Justice Policy and Alexandra Citrin, Senior Associate from Center for the Study of Social Policy (CSSP)

♣ Michele led further discussion among the SAG member to begin to identify the current efforts across Michigan that supports family health and well-being. The goal is to identify the workgroups and task forces aimed at the same goals and objectives of ECC.

The group identified the following:

Current efforts promoting healthy families and communities, fatherhood, and lived experience.

- ♣ MI-AIMH Social Action Committee (just relaunched!) and online trainings.
- Family Support Specialists assigned to all enrolled families. Regularly meet with families, home visits, parent engagement events, meetings and training.
- Think babies parent network (also has a fatherhood link)
- ♣ Michigan Child Care Provider Collective
- ♣ Think Babies Michigan parent network
- ♣ Think Babies Michigan and Michigan's Children policy priorities
- ♣ Youth Advocacy Program pairs adult professionals with lived expertise in foster care with teens in foster care to develop self-advocacy skills
- State Home Visiting Programs
- Use the voice of Parents. There are no disclosures needed!
- ♣ Zero to Thrive/Fraternity of Fathers. Peer Coaches/Advocates. Prevention programming in schools and community centers. NEAR Science/ACEs master trainers.
- Expanded access to behavioral health services through the Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics
- ♣ Title V Maternal Child Health Programs & Services
- Front-end redesign initiative (prevention, CPS).
- Active engagement with Guy Thompson Parent Advisory Council (GTPAC) group of parents with lived experience (emphasis on recruiting and retaining fathers specifically). Embedded within CPS program office/CPS & Redesign Unit.
- PRAMS for Dads
- ♣ MI Federation: Child Welfare Protective Factors Training Initiative MiFamily Together Pilot
- Maternal & Infant Health Family/Community Town Halls

Current Efforts in the courts, and child welfare promoting safety, prevention, and fairness within the system.

- ♣ Put Parents on the Review Board, use their knowledge. Celebrate the Wins, let families know that the work is being done, acknowledge that their voice is being heard
- ♣ Use the voice of Doulas
- ♣ SCAO Court Improvement Program Child Welfare Services resources through the Court Improvement Program (CIP). Best practices resources: Child Protection Handbook for Parents, Foster Parent Guide to Court, Judicial Bench Cards, ongoing training.
- CPS Redesign. Contract with MPHI to overhaul mandated reporter training. Enhanced SDM safety and risk assessments. Enhanced Plan of Safe Care. Revised/enhanced human trafficking protocol.

- Prevention and preservation addressing safety, implicit bias, and disparities. Use
 of structured support tool in 2023, using a decision tree, poverty does not equal
 neglect, enhanced maltreatment types, enhanced safety and risk factors.
- ♣ Foster Care Review Board (FCRB) reviews child welfare cases randomly and by request.
